A Word from John:

Today we remember our patron saint, Timothy, the bright young devoted protégé and companion of St. Paul. Timothy was one of a tight-knit band of followers of Jesus whose determined work resulted in the world being turned upside down. Paul's work as a mentor was profound and those around him were deeply loyal.

Timothy, Titus, Luke, Epaphroditus, Silas, Barnabas Tychicus, Demas and others became the vanguard of an evangelistic effort the effects of which are still being felt in the world. You and I are here today in a very real way because of this earnest

young guild of preachers who became the centre of mission to those outside the Jewish faith. They were the ones that led the surge that disseminated the Gospel message throughout the Roman Empire and beyond that Jesus had come for all people.

Timothy was invaluable to Paul for many reasons not the least of which was that he came from a multicultural multifaith setting. His hometown of Lystra in modern-day Turkey was situated on a major Roman highway and was frequented by traders and Roman soldiers from many places of origin. These mingled with the local people who were known for their own quite strange local dialect.

With each passing year, the wisdom of our forebears is increasingly evident. I was told recently that the two Census Tracts around our church are two of the most multicultural Census Tracts in the GTA which is the most multicultural urban centre in Canada. That places us in the very centre of multi-cultural life in our nation. Here in this setting, the choice of Timothy as our patron saint is itself a statement to us and to all that everyone is welcome; all are included in God's message of salvation and new life.
